

Request for Information Summary

Community Re-Entry  
Island of Oahu

A Request for Information (RFI) for the provision of Community Re-Entry on the island of Oahu for individuals with severe and persistent mental illness was posted on April 28, 2011 and reissued on May 12, 2011. Four (4) written responses were received. Below is a summary of the information received through this process as it relates to the questions from the RFI.

Written feedback was received from four (4) respondents.

1. Does your organization currently provide AMHD-contracted services?

*All four (4) respondents have experience working with individuals with serious and persistent mental illness as well as criminal justice involvement.*

2. If you responded yes to the above question, please briefly (one page or less) describe the program including target population, program size (persons serviced), location of services and description of evidence-based practice used by the program to reduce recidivism and criminogenic need. *No responses.*

3. If an RFP is issued, would your organization be interested in providing Community Re-Entry services on Oahu? *No responses.*

4. If an RFP is issued, how do you propose to be able to provide shelter and care for someone (who may not have benefits) with SPMI immediately upon unplanned (unanticipated) release from incarceration?

*All respondents discussed at least temporary options for sheltering inmates immediately upon release.*

5. If you are interested in providing Community Re-Entry services, please describe the types of community relationships you have with the criminal justice community that would/or does facilitate this type of program. Describe.

*All four (4) respondents indicated having existing collaborations with criminal justice providers.*

6. If an RFP is issued, what would you recommend for performance indicators? Describe.

*All four (4) respondents suggested a number of possible performance indicators, very similar to each other.*

The AMHD appreciates the comments and suggestions received regarding the RFI for Community Re-Entry Services. Feedback from the community is important in issuing a stronger scope of services and we anticipate the RFP to be released within the next few months.
